A few words from the coordinating school

Portugal is a country bathed by the Atlantic Ocean and it has served as an engine for the development of trade, transport, mineral extraction, energy generation, as well as being one of our main sources of food. For these reasons,

we have a double responsibility not only to protect it, but also to make it known to our partners.

And that is what we did during the week of 7-11 November, a week integrated in the C4 mobility and where we were the host school.

The visit to Sintra showed us the colourful tones of the Pena National Palace, the greatest exponent of Romanticism in Portugal and the eternal work of King Fernando II, the King-Artist. The Sintra National Palace made us relive memories and testimonies of exciting events in the History of Portugal!

At the Navy Museum and Jerónimos Monastery, foreign teachers and students understood how much the Sea is associated to our History and Culture and how much it contributed to the Portuguese maritime expansion.

At the Oceanarium, the students were able to observe the marine life existing in the various Oceans and learned that it is impossible to dissociate the Oceans, as they are one Ocean, global and very diverse!

Back at School, it was time to communicate, investigate and create, in a single "voice"... The workshops allowed students to interact, sharing knowledge and experiences, respecting more and more the Ocean and the species that depend on it!

Science, Culture and Art merged into a single purpose - to promote more and better environmental sustainability.

DAY 2

The second day was dedicated to many project activities. We headed to the Creiro beach - one of the most beautiful beaches in Setubal. Ecological brigades from five countries were in action. We cleaned the beach, collected rubbish and natural elements to be analysed later. We walked along the beach and enjoyed the peaceful environment and the beautiful view.













On our way back to Odivelas we stopped for a while at Strada Outlet Shopping Centre where students distributed some brochures - a public awareness action for the protection of the oceans.





In the afternoon two workshops for students took place. The first one - Practical Maths aimed to work on litter and sand collection on the beach. The litter was sorted, classified, weighed and recorded in Marine Litter Watch and in Google Earth Digital Tool. The sand was also analysed in order to detect microplastics and to observe its characteristics and constitution.







The second workshop, Seawater Analysis Laboratory, aimed to analyse the water samples taken from the Creiro Beach. The students were shown the PH scale and the different procedures for measuring it, using the universal indicator paper. After measuring, the results were discussed.



While students worked hard at the workshops, a coordinators' meeting took place. During the meeting teachers discussed next project mobilities and future project activities, difficulties encountered, issues with the final report.

It's a sunny day here in Lisbon and we arrive at the Lisbon **Oceanarium** very excited to visit it. The Oceanarium, one of the largest indoor aquarium in Europe, is located in the Parque das Nações, which is part of the area developed for the World Expo in 1998.


It is said to resemble an aircraft carrier, and it is built on a pier in an artificial lagoon.

The Lisbon Oceanarium has a huge collection of marine species: penguins, seagulls, sea otters, sharks, seahorses, starfish, corals, octopuses, cuttlefish, jellyfish, marine plants and terrestrial plants and other marine organisms totaling about 16,000 individuals of 450 species.

This morning is going to be more and more fascinating! After participating two interesting workshops about "Biodiversity" and "Inside Out Animals", we are going to observe different habitats with their native flora and fauna: the North Atlantic rocky coast, the Antarctic coastal line, the Temperate Pacific kelp forests, and the Tropical Indian coral reefs.

Colorful fish, bright lights, nice sounds all around us!

We could easily say that this experience will be unforgettable!



The Jeronimos Monastery is a former monastery of the Order of Saint Jerome near the Tagus river and it was erected in the early 1500s near the launch point of Vasco da Gama's first journey. In 1983 it was classified as a UNESCO World Heritage site.

The **Navy Museum** is a maritime museum dedicated to all aspects of the history of navigation in Portugal and we can admire historical paintings, archaeological items and many scale models of ships used in Portugal since the 15th century.

This amazing day ends on a high note, let's go to the "Pastéis de Belem" pastry factory, located just a short 3-minute walk from the Jeronimos Monastery. In this pastry shop we can taste the famous Portuguese Pastel de Nata, an egg custard tart pastry, op-

tionally dusted with cinnamon. Served hot, with the vanilla flavor and the smell of cinnamon, these treats send our taste buds into ecstasy!

DAY



On the 4^{th} day, we departed from Moinhos da Arroja School by bus towards Sintra at 8:15 in the morning.

Sintra has been classified as a World Heritage Site under the "Cultural Landscape" category by UNESCO since 1995. It was the refuge of kings, queens and noblemen with a multitude of palaces and parks, noble houses and their gardens, meditation con-

vents, fountains, churches, chapels and hermitages, secular centers of faith





We had a guided tour in the National Palace of Sintra where all the kings and queens of Portugal lived until the end of monarchy in 1910.

We had our lunch in a local restaurant in the historical center of Sintra.





After lunch we took the bus to the Park and Palace of Pena which was created by King Fernando II in the 19th century.







We walked to Pena Palace through the park and forest with hundreds of tree species from various parts of the world. We had a guided tour in this colourful Palace.

Our morning started bright and early, with two workshops:

- "Transforming Waste into Art", with the well-known children's book illustrator and graphic designer, Danuta Wojciechowska;
- "Programming with Makey-Makey and Scratch", with Ms. Sílvia Menezes.

In the first activity, we reflected on the state of the ocean by creating a sculptural totem that, like a lighthouse, points out the factors that endanger the health of marine life and the survival of our own species on this blue planet. Each group of students prepared and decorated wooden pieces, respecting the unifying theme, using materials (rubbish) that were collected on Creiro Beach in Setúbal! At the end, we put all the pieces together and obtained a tower (a totem), full of diversity and colour! A piece of art! It's exhibited in our Erasmus Corner, in the School Library.

In the second workshop, planned by Ms. Sílvia Menezes, one of the coordinating teachers of the Erasmus project, we experimented with block programming, using the programming language "scratch" in association with the Makey Makey board. This board, which works based on the principle of the passage of energy through bodies, allows us to transform almost any common object into "commands", which send information to the computer in the same way as a keyboard or mouse!

After lunch, we headed to the school auditorium, where the farewell ceremony took place. The Headmaster, Mr. Paulo Bernardo, presented the closing speech and distributed the certificates of participation to all the elements of

this mobility.


